#### Field Notes: WORCESTER COUNTY BIRDS 2016

The weather during January and February of 2016 averaged a bit warmer than normal. There were rain and snow storms but nothing too extreme. March was mild, but there was snow in early April. Beginning in May all of Massachusetts entered an extended period of high temps and little rain. Water bans spread across the state. This meant that conditions were right in several locations for late summer shorebirds as edge habitat was exposed. Particularly productive were the strictly off-limits reservoirs of Worcester. The drought continued well into fall. December saw cold temps, especially as the Christmas Count period began.

County birders tallied 247 species for the year. Though there were no new species added to the County list, there were plenty of high points. Among them was a Cackling Goose. The lack of reports of this species in the County is something of a mystery to me. Cackling Geese are regular along the Connecticut River to our immediate west, where small flocks have even been reported. Cackling Geese are also reported yearly to the east of the County. But Worcester County seems to be like Kryptonite to this species. This is odd because the County regularly hosts other uncommon to rare goose species like Snow, Greater White-fronted and even Pink-footed. Personally, I have scanned what seems like many thousands of goose flocks, and Cackling Geese are just not a yearly species here. Here I must interject a note of caution as small Canada Geese ARE regular here and can easily be mistaken for Cackling by birders not familiar with the species. You cannot just go by size of the body, stubby bill and rounded head; you also need to look at fine details of plumage. All reports should be accompanied by full particulars or photos.

Other good finds included Cattle Egret, now much rarer in the state than it was twenty years ago. A Red-necked Phalarope flew in with a small flock of yellowlegs at Quinapoxet Reservoir and was photo documented as it flew off. This again points out the importance of photo-documenting rarities in the County. Also found was a Rufous Hummingbird, now almost yearly in the County.

The Laughing Gull found by Kevin Bourinot at Wachusett Reservoir in mid-August stayed until early September. This species is a real rarity in the County, and birders needed patience and skill to spot it as it seemed to wander all over the reservoir. This is only the second accepted report of this species in the County. The first accepted report was seen at Wachusett Reservoir after a hurricane on 9-17-99 by Sheila Carroll, Mark Lynch, Simon Perkins (of Mass Audubon at the time) and others. There are 3 previous reports of this species in the County mentioned in Bob Bradbury's *Bird List of Worcester County* (1991): "Late August 1949 E. Brookfield 1 (Allen); May 9, 1950 Blackstone 3 (Crompton); May 13, 1979 Boylston 2ad (Blodget)". But none of these reports were accepted by the Chickadee because of the "three viewer" rule begun by Blodget: any new species to the County has to be seen by at least three observers or photographed for the bird to be accepted on the official County list. I should mention that this "rule" is not followed by the Massachusetts Avian Reports Committee.

The Harris's Sparrow at the Westborough WMA also required some patience because one had to wait quietly for the stream of joggers and dog walkers to pass for this striking sparrow to finally come out onto the trail. The last Harris's Sparrow that I saw in the County was a bird found by

Charlie Quinlan at Bolton Flats on 10-19-85 and seen by Charlie, Sheila Carroll and me the following day.

A much more frustrating bird was the Varied Thrush coming to feeders in Rutland. It was in an area of icy dirt roads and private homes on a lake. There were no great places to park without blocking roads or driveways. Soon neighbors began to become incensed as some birders stupidly began to trespass on private property in order to try to spot this not too cooperative bird. Word soon got out that birders were no longer welcomed to the area and we have no idea what the actual out date was.

Finally, one of the most exciting reports was of the first apparent nesting of Merlin in the County. This was in a planted conifer in a cemetery in Barre. Noisy fledglings were spotted being tended by an adult. Unfortunately, this event was not repeated the following year. Merlins are opportunistic nesters, nesting when the time is right and they use an already constructed nest. Outliers often do not return to the same area the following year.

All in all, 2016 was another good year for birds in the County. Be sure to get out there in all seasons and keep detailed field notes of anything unusual.

- **SNOW GOOSE** (Anser caerulescens): All reports: Jan. 9 Westborough 4 (Larson), Nov. 23 Westborough WMA 1 (Spahr) and Dec. 12 Nipmuc Pond in Mendon 50 (Canovale).
- GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE (A. albifrons): Jan. 17 (Bourinot) to Feb. 11 (Lynch & Carroll) probably same single bird also reported by various observers during time period from Coachlace Pond, Clinton High baseball field, Bolton Flats, and Dexter Drumlin. Also, Mar. 27 Rutland 1 (Bailey) and Oct. 24 Holden 1 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **BRANT** (*Branta bernicla*): Two reports: Oct. 7 Wachusett Res. Boylston 7 (B. Kamp) and Nov. 6 Gate 40 Wachusett Res. 1 (Bourinot).
- **CANADA GOOSE** (*B. canadensis*): Permanent resident. Max. Feb. 28 Bolton Flats 1302 (Lynch & Carroll) and Jan. 30 Dexter Drumlin 1000 (Johnson, Murray).
- **CACKLING GOOSE** (B. hutchinsii): Fifth Worcester County Record. Two reports, possibly same single bird Nov. 26 Lake Quinsigamond and Dec. 8 to Dec. 16 Wachusett Res. (both by Lynch & Carroll).
- MUTE SWAN (Cygnus olor): Permanent resident. Max. Nov. 20 Westborough 123 (Lynch & Carroll) and Jan. 1 Westborough 93 (Paulson).
- WOOD DUCK (Aix sponsa): Reported throughout the year, but only scattered reports during winter. Max. Mar. 20 Bolton Flats 35 (Ammerman), Oct. 16 Sterling 45 (Robo) and Sept. 2 Ekblaw Sanctuary Paxton 62 (Jenkins).
- **BLUE-WINGED TEAL** (*Spatula discors*): Apr. 2 Bolton Flats 1 (Johnson) to May 13 Bolton Flats 1 (Paulson). Then, Aug. 29 Sterling 1 (B. Kamp) to Oct. 15 Northborough 1 (Dowling). Max. Apr. 13 Bolton Flats 3 (Beattie) and May 5 Westborough WMA 3 (Paulson).
- **NORTHERN SHOVELER** (S. clypeata): Winter report Jan. 24 Lake Quinsigamond 1 (Lawson). Then, Mar. 19 Bolton Flats 2 (Pirro#) to May 11 Oxford 1 (Meleski, Dufault). Max. May 9 West Boylston 6 (D. Williams). No fall reports.
- GADWALL (*Mareca strepera*): Lingerers continued until Feb. 15 Clinton 1 (Pirro), and either an over-winterer or early migrant Mar. 12 Westborough 1 (Johnson). Then, in spring 1 or 2 birds reported from Broad Meadow Brook WS Apr. 13 (Liller) to May 27 (Robo). Unusual

- summer report July 14 Warren 1 (Cook). Then, Oct. 18 Quaboag Pond 1 (Bourget) to Nov. 4 Broad Meadow Brook WS 2 (Gach, Robo). Max. Jan. 16 Millbury 4 (Lawson).
- AMERICAN WIGEON (M. americana): Either an early migrant or over-winterer Feb. 22 Westborough 1 (Miller). Then, main spring period Mar. 16 Bolton Flats 1 (Johnson) to May 2 Spencer (Lynch & Carroll). One summer report Aug. 31 to Sept. 1 Westborough 1 (Spahr, Miller). In the fall, Oct. 9 Quaboag Pond 3 (Lynch & Carroll) to Dec. 6 Holden 1 (Robo). Max. Mar. 19 Bolton Flats 4 (Pirro) and Oct. 23 Northborough 4 (Lawson).
- **MALLARD** (*Anas platyrhynchos*): Permanent resident. Max. Jan. 6 Brookfield 322 (Lynch & Carroll), Jan. 31 Charlton 550 (Jenkins), and Nov. 11 Gardner 400 (Pirro).
- AMERICAN BLACK DUCK (A. rubripes): Permanent resident, but only scattered reports during breeding season. Max. Oct. 8 Delaney WMA 35 (Oxley, Sgroi, Markiewicz).
- NORTHERN PINTAIL (A. acuta): Winter reports Jan. 1 Quaboag Pond 4 (Lynch & Carroll#), Jan. 24 Lake Quinsigamond 1 (Lawson), and Jan. 31 Fitchburg 1 (Pirro). Then, Feb. 28 Bolton Flats 2 (Lynch & Carroll) to Apr. 8 Bolton Flats 4, also max., (Dengler & Miller). In the fall, Oct. 27 Westborough WMA 2 to Dec. 4 Broad Meadow Brook WS 1 (Robo).
- GREEN-WINGED TEAL (A. crecca): Winter report Jan. 1 Auburn 2 (Marble). Then, Feb. 28 Bolton Flats 40 (Murray) to May 9 Westborough WMA 1 (Paulson). In the fall, Aug. 24 Gate 43 Quabbin 2 (Lawson) to Dec. 26 1 Wachusett Res. (Lynch & Carroll). Spring Max. Mar. 29 Bolton Flats 300 (Johnson). Fall Max. Sept. 17 Rutland 46 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **CANVASBACK** (*Aythya valisineria*): All reports: Jan. 18 Southborough 1 (Young) and up to 5 birds were reported from Lake Quinsigamond by various observers from Jan. 24 (Robo) to Jan. 27 (v.o.)
- **REDHEAD** (A. americana): All reports: Jan. 18 Southborough 1 (Young) and a single bird was reported from Lake Quinsigamond by various observers from Jan. 24 to Jan. 27 (Robo, v.o.)
- RING-NECKED DUCK (A. collaris): Winter reports: Jan. 1 Westborough WMA 2 (Paulson), Millbury 2 (Marble), and first half max. Jan. 2 Southborough 228 (Paulson). Returning in spring Feb. 23 Templeton 1 (Pirro) to May 11 Petersham 1 (Watkevitch). Returning Oct. 15 Westborough 8 (Dowling) to year's end Westborough WMA 4 (Spahr). Second half max. Dec. 9 Southborough 230 (Garvey).
- GREATER SCAUP (A. marila): Winter reports: Jan. 1 Clinton 1 (Bourinot), Jan. 12 Wachusett Res. 130, also first half max., (Lynch & Carroll), and Feb. 4 Wachusett Res. 53 (Bourinot). Returning Mar. 16 Clinton 16 (Lawson) to year's end Wachusett Res. 26 (Davies). Second half max. Nov. 26 Clinton 80 (Pirro).
- **LESSER SCAUP** (*A. affinis*): Nine reports from five locations during winter beginning Jan. 18 Southborough 5 (Young) to Feb. 4 Clinton 13 (Bourinot). Returning Mar. 17 Clinton 2 (Johnson) to Apr. 20 Petersham 2 (Castriotta). In fall, returning Oct. 13 Northborough 1 (Dowling) to Nov. 26 Clinton 6 (Pirro). Two birds continued through Dec. at Wachusett Res. (Lynch & Carroll).
- **SURF SCOTER** (*Melanitta perspicillata*): All reports, only in fall: up to 9 birds reported from Wachusett Res. from Oct. 14 (Robo) to Oct. 19 (Lynch & Carroll), Oct. 29 a single bird reported there (Bourinot), up to 4 birds there Nov. 5 (Lynch & Carroll, Bourinot), Nov. 24 a single bird (Dowling), and another single Dec. 1 (Lynch & Carroll). Away from Wachusett Res., Oct. 27 Gardner 6 (Pirro) and Nov. 26 Quaboag Pond 1 (Bourget).

- WHITE-WINGED SCOTER (M. fusca): No spring reports. In the fall, Oct. 10 Wachusett Res. 12, also max., (Lynch & Carroll) to Nov. 27 Quaboag Pond 1 (Bourget).
- **BLACK SCOTER** (*M. americana*): One spring report, Mar. 25 Worcester 2 (Robo, Kittredge). Fall: Oct. 10 with arrival at four locations (v.o.), and max. at Wachusett Res. 180 (Lynch & Carroll). Only other date reported in fall was Nov. 7 Gardner 3 (Pirro).
- **LONG-TAILED DUCK** (*Clangula hyemalis*): Only reported in the fall, Oct. 17 Wachusett Res. 4 (Robo) with six interim reports. Last reported Dec. 19 Wachusett Res. 1 (Meleski).
- BUFFLEHEAD (*Bucephala albeola*): Four winter reports: Jan. 1 West Waushacum Pond, Sterling 4 (Bourinot), Jan. 27 Clinton 3 (B. Kamp), Jan. 31 Coachlace Pond, Clinton 1 (Bourinot), Feb. 4 Wachusett Res. 2 (Bourinot), and Feb. 6 Westborough WMA 3 (Lane). In spring, Feb. 25 Westborough 2 (Paulson) to May 7 Wachusett Res. 3 (Bourget, Johnson). Spring max. Apr. 10 Southborough 28 (Lynch & Carroll). In fall, Oct. 10 Quaboag Pond 1 (Bourget) to Nov. 19 Southborough 34 (Dowling, Sovay), and a fall max. Nov. 6 Westborough 37 (Paulson). A second half winter report Dec. 26 Wachusett Res. 7 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **COMMON GOLDENEYE** (*B. clangula*): Scattered winter reports with a first half max. Jan. 6 Wachusett Res. 45 (B. Kamp). In spring, Feb. 9 Lake Quinsigamond 34 (Lynch & Carroll), to Apr. 11 Gardner 3 (Pirro). In fall, Oct. 27 Westborough WMA up to 2 birds (v.o.) to Dec. 28 Wachusett Res. 14 (Davies). Fall max. Nov. 19 Southborough 76 (Dowling, Sovay).
- **BARROW'S GOLDENEYE** (*B. islandica*): Two reports: a single bird from Nov. 19 Southborough 1 (Dowling, Sovay) to Nov. 27 (Lawson) and a female Dec. 16 to the 18<sup>th</sup> at Wachusett Res. (Lynch & Carroll).
- **HOODED MERGANSER** (*Lophodytes cucullatus*): Present year round with open water. First half max. Feb. 25 Westborough 65 (Paulson). Second half max. Dec. 3 Brookfields 132 and Dec. 16 Wachusett Res. 104 (Lynch & Carroll).
- COMMON MERGANSER (Mergus merganser): First half through May 8 Wachusett Res. 1 (Kittredge, Miller). Spring max. Mar. 10 Westborough 1,000 (Gove). Two late spring reports: May 25 Gardner 1 (Roesselet) and June 26 Wachusett Res. 1 (Bourinot). Scattered breeding reports around Quabbin and northwestern Worcester County. In fall, Sept. 22 Holden 12 (Lynch & Carroll) to year's end. Second half max. Dec. 3 Brookfields 570 (Lynch & Carroll) and Dec. 10 South Pond, Brookfield 610 (Jenkins).
- **RED-BREASTED MERGANSER** (*M. serrator*): Five reports: Jan. 21 Wachusett Res. 3 (B. Kamp), May 7 Wachusett Res. 1 (Bourget, Johnson). Then, joined by a second bird May 14 (Bourinot). In fall, Nov. 5 Wachusett Res. 1 and Nov. 12 Brookfields 1 (Lynch & Carroll).
- RUDDY DUCK (Oxyura jamaicensis): Four winter reports: Jan. 1 Brookfields 22, also max., (Lynch & Carroll), Jan. 8 Westborough WMA 1 (Spahr), Jan. 24 to Jan. 29 Lake Quinsigamond 12, 4 (Robo, eBird), and Jan. 31 Wachusett Res. 1 (Dowling). - WILD TURKEY (*Meleagris gallopavo*): Permanent resident. Max. Jan. 4 Petersham 65 (Small) and Mar. 10 Templeton 85 (Pirro).

- PIED-BILLED GREBE (*Podilymbus podiceps*): In spring, Mar. 11 Auburn 1 (Rees), Westborough WMA 1 (Spahr) to Apr. 18 WRW 1 (Lynch & Carroll). Only report during breeding season: June 19 Bolton Flats WMA 1 (Arena). In fall, Aug. 16 Sterling 1 (Robo) to Dec. 18 Boylston 1 (Lynch & Carroll). Max. Oct. 7 Bartlett Pond, Northborough 5 (Dowling).
- **HORNED GREBE** (*Podiceps auritus*): In spring, Mar. 24 Wachusett Res. 1 (Robo) to Apr. 9 Wachusett Res. 1 (Bourinot). In fall, Oct. 19 Wachusett Res. 2 (Lynch & Carroll) to Dec. 28 Wachusett Res. 2 (Davies). Max. Oct. 31 Gardener 7 (Pirro) and Nov. 19 Gate 37 Quabbin Res. 7 (Hoye, Robo).
- **RED-NECKED GREBE** (*P. grisegena*): All reports: Sept. 10 Wachusett Res. 1 (Bourinot#), Oct. 15 to Oct. 22 Wachusett Res. 2 (Lawson, v.o.), Nov. 11 to Nov. 12 Lake Lashaway 1 (Robo#), Nov. 12 Gate 35 Quabbin Res. 1 (Pirro), Nov. 18 Wachusett Res. 1 (Bourinot), and Dec. 19 Wachusett Res. 1 (Meleski).
- **ROCK PIGEON** (*Columba livia*): Permanent resident. Max. Nov. 24 Quaboag Pond 150 (Lynch & Carroll) and Dec. 17 ACC 464.
- **MOURNING DOVE** (*Zenaida macroura*): Permanent resident. Max. Nov. 30 Westborough 125 (Spahr) and Dec. 14 SCC 414.
- **YELLOW-BILLED CUCKOO** (*Coccyzus americanus*): May 11 Westborough 1 (Williams) to Sept. 7 Athol 1 (Watkevich). Max. June 4 Westborough 6 (Spahr) and June 17 Quabbin Res. 6 (Swain).
- **BLACK-BILLED CUCKOO** (*C. erythropthalmus*): May 10 Oxbow NWR 1 (Bourinot) to Aug. 26 Athol 1 (Watkevich). Max. June 17 Quabbin Res. 9 (Swain).
- **COMMON NIGHTHAWK** (*Chordeiles minor*): Spring: May 13 Westborough 1 (Paulson) to June 28 Worcester 1 (Meleski). Fall: Aug. 7 Lancaster 1 (Barstow) to Sept. 18 Westborough 1 (Robo). Max. Aug. 26 Leicester 104 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **EASTERN WHIP-POOR-WILL** (*Caprimulgus vociferous*): May 2 Lancaster 1 (Johnson) to June 14 Bolton Flats 4 (Kembel). One fall report: Sept. 3 Wachusett Res 1 (Robo). Max. June 11 North Brookfield 11 (Lynch & Carroll).
- CHIMNEY SWIFT (*Chaetura pelagica*): Apr. 20 Worcester 1 (Meleski) to Sept. 15 Westborough 1 (Spahr). Max. May 20 Templeton 48 (Pirro).
- RUBY-THROATED HUMMINGBIRD (*Archilochus colubris*): Apr. 25 Bolton 1 (Skillin) to Oct. 4 Worcester 1 (LaBree). Max. Aug. 28 Uxbridge 12 (Huntington).
- **RUFOUS HUMMINGBIRD** (*Selasphorus rufus*): Oct. 7 to Oct. 29 Westborough 1 (Williams, v.o.). This bird showed up at a residential feeder and was banded and measured.
- **KING RAIL** (*Rallus elegans*): Two reports: May 22 Bolton Flats 1 (Arena) and June 25 Brookfield 1 (Jenkins).
- VIRGINIA RAIL (R. limicola): Mar. 27 Petersham 1 (Small) to Oct. 24 Westborough 1 (Spahr). Also, a late report Nov. 24 Brookfield 1 (Lynch & Carroll). Max. May 7 New Braintree 8 (Buelow), May 10 Westborough 7 (Paulson), and June 19 Bolton Flats 34 (Arena).

#### SAW-WHET OWL BANDING 2016 LOOKOUT ROCK, NORTHBRIDGE

Fall 2016 was the 14th season of Saw-whet Owl banding at Lookout Rock. Saw-whets were banded on each of 20 nights between Oct. 4 and end-of-season on Nov. 12. Season total: 151 owls banded. In addition, 3 Saw-whet owls were recaptured that had been banded at other stations (foreign recaptures).

Of this total, 79% were female; 6% were male; and sex could not be determined for 15%. Plumage patterns indicated that 56% of the owls were hatch year; 44% were Second-year or older.

Foreign Recaptures: banded at Hopkins Forest, Williamstown, in 2015; banded at Drumlin Farm, Lincoln, in 2013; another banded at Drumlin Farm six days prior to recapture at Lookout Rock.

Two saw-whets banded at Lookout Rock in 2014 were recaptured elsewhere: in Montreal (banding station operated by McGill University) and in W. Virginia.

On October 3, a good flight night with perfect conditions--cold, clear, windless--32 owls were netted. Other good flight nights were Oct. 19 (18 owls), Oct. 26 (18 owls), and Nov. 1 (15 owls).

About 135 visitors attended these banding sessions, including a number of local birders and college students, the Hampshire Bird Club from the Amherst area, and Stonybrook Audubon in Norfolk.

#### PASSERINE BANDING AT WEST HILL PARK, NORTHBRIDGE

West Hill Park-West Hill Dam is a 567-acre complex operated by the Army Corps of Engineers along the West River in Northbridge and Uxbridge. The habitat includes woodland, field and marsh, which supports a diversity of bird species. Since 2001, the banding program has documented 98 species of passerines at West Hill Park during spring and fall migration.

#### **SPRING 2016**

Mist nets were opened on only three days: May 21, May 28, and May 29, 2016. Total netted: 42 birds of 22 species, including recaptures. Peak day was May 21, when 30 birds of 17 species were netted.

Banded birds of note included: Willow Flycatcher and female Orchard Oriole. Recaptures of birds banded in prior seasons included a Great Crested Flycatcher banded at the park in May 2015 and a Yellow Warbler banded as an adult in May 2013 (now at least 6 years old).

The regular spring and fall migration banding project at West Hill Park has been completed. We appreciate the support of the Army Corps of Engineers and the staff at West Hill Dam in permitting the use of their facility for this bird banding project.
