FIELD NOTES: WORCESTER COUNTY BIRDS 2017

The winter months of 2017 were fairly typical, but snowstorms continued well into mid-March. May started rather cold with below normal temperatures. June was warmer than average and that month also featured several flash floods. Later in the summer saw more typical temps with lower than typical rainfall.

Birders tallied 243 species in Worcester County in 2017. The Ross's Goose (or, possibly, geese) was the only species found in 2017 that was new for the County list. This sharp-looking and compact goose was first spotted in south County at the end of February. The bird then disappeared, and it, or another Ross's Goose, was later discovered in Southborough in mid-March. People may assume it is the same bird, but truthfully we cannot be sure. Ross's Geese were unknown in the state before the mid-1990s. In 1997 Ross's Geese began to appear in Massachusetts, first along the Connecticut River Valley. Two were spotted among a large flock of Snow Geese that had put down in Hatfield at the end of March in 1997. From then on, Ross's Geese have appeared in the state every few years, often in the Valley. Though single birds are most often noted, a flock of 8 adults was found at Arcadia MAS in Northampton in mid-March of 2009.

Another great find was the Tufted Duck found in mid-May in a small pond in Princeton, apparently "with" a small flock of Ring-necked Ducks. This bird has been declared the "second" record for the County. But that depends on how you keep reports. In 1995 Worcester County's first Tufted Duck was noted in a flock of scaup. A Tufted Duck was found in every year thereafter until 2002! The/A Tufted Duck was spotted between October and mid-March in those intervening years and was found in a variety of locations including West Waushacum, Wachusett Reservoir, Coachlace Pond, Lake Quinsigamond and Flint Pond. It has been assumed that all through those years, this was the same Tufted Duck, in that it usually appeared in a flock of scaup. In February 2003, a Tufted Duck was found among a flock of scaup at Bold Point in Providence, RI which is the southern terminus of the Blackstone National Corridor. Thereafter, until 2008, a Tufted Duck was found along the river feeding into James Turner Reservoir, East Providence. This is close to Bold Point and also part of the Blackstone National Corridor. If all those Worcester County reports are of the same Tufted Duck, then I wonder if the duck eventually left the County and suddenly began to appear south. The Blackstone River and adjacent ponds are a natural flyway north to south for waterfowl. Who can tell?

Other good finds included Eurasian Wigeon, Cattle Egret, a third report of Laughing Gull, another Red-necked Phalarope, a one-day-wonder Painted Bunting that appeared at a feeder, and finally a relatively co-operative LeConte's Sparrow at Bolton Flats. This bird was of state-wide interest. LeConte's are small, relatively colorful *Ammodramus* sparrows and notorious skulkers. They breed in wet grasslands in central Canada and northern mid-west. That this bird could be found in the acres of perfect habitat that comprise Bolton Flats in fall is amazing. But the fact that the bird could be refound for several days is nothing short of incredible. Though there are a small handful of reports for the County of LeConte's, this 2017 bird was the first that was fully documented with numerous photographs.

One of the most unusual bird sightings in the County for 2017 will not be found on the species list. While teaching an adult natural history class at Broad Meadow Brook, two of the students, Martin and Margaret Bowden, showed me some stunning photographs of an unusual male oriole that were just taken at their feeders 7-8 May. I recognized it as a tropical oriole, but could not identify the species and asked them to submit the photographs to the Massachusetts Avian Records Committee (MARC). The bird was eventually identified as a Black-backed Oriole (*Icterus abeillei*), a species from Mexico.

Because of anomalies in the facial patterning, this was shown to be the very same bird that had appeared at feeders in Sinking Spring, Pennsylvania 31 January 2017-16 April, 2017. Interestingly, there was a later report of a Black-backed Oriole from Stamford, Connecticut 14 May 2017.

Though there is no question about the identification of the species, the record was not accepted by the MARC for several reasons. There is no history of vagrancy of this species and it is a species found in the caged bird trade. The Bowden's bird could therefore have had a captive origin. Records like this are fascinating and may later prove to be important. If future sightings occur well to the north of its range that may establish a pattern of vagrancy, and that may prove that this was a countable bird after all. But, for now, just tuck this sighting away and file it under "probable escape." What an exciting sighting for the Bowdens!

Another amazing year for County birding. Let's have an even more exciting 2018!

- SNOW GOOSE (Anser caerulescens): Winter reports: Jan. 1 to Jan. 7 Westborough WMA 1 (v.o.). Two spring reports Mar. 28 Athol 25, also max., (B. Kamp, v.o.) and Apr. 12 Delaney WMA 2 (Dalconzo). Then, multiple fall reports from various observers from Oct. 17 Westborough WMA 7 (Faughnan) to Dec. 27 Sterling 1 (Bourinot).
- ROSS'S GOOSE (A. rossii): First Worcester County Record. A single bird was first reported on Feb. 23 on Arcade Pond in Northbridge (Kittredge). It was then seen and photographed by multiple observers in the interim until the following day on nearby Whitins Pond. Two other reports, possibly the same bird, were reported in Southborough from Mar. 12 (Lynch & Carroll) to Mar. 13 (Garvey), and at the Westborough WMA from Mar. 28 (Robo) to the Mar. 30 (Furbish, Peacock).
- GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE (A. albifrons): Three reports, possibly all the same bird: Nov. 2 in the Muschopauge Pond area in Rutland (Lynch & Carroll) until the next day (v.o.). Another report, Nov. 19 from Pine Hill Res. in Rutland (Lynch & Carroll). The last report was Dec. 8 from Paxton 1 (Jenkins).
- **BRANT** (*Branta bernicla*): Multiple reports in fall only: Oct. 24 Gardner 1 (Kittredge) to Nov. 19 Quaboag IBA 1 (Lynch & Carroll). Max. Nov. 4 Lake Quinsigamond 4 (Dekker)
- CANADA GOOSE (B. canadensis): Permanent resident. Max. Feb. 4 Clinton 1000 (Pirro) and Dec. 17 Wachusett Res. 950 (Robo).
- MUTE SWAN (Cygnus olor): Permanent resident. Max. Mar. 25 Westborough 80 (Abbott) and Dec. 8 Westborough 127 (Lynch & Carroll).
- WOOD DUCK (Aix sponsa): Two winter reports: Jan. 13 (Small) to Feb. 23 Gardner 1 (Pirro), and Jan 16 Clinton 2 (Abbott). Then, general arrival Feb. 24 Northbridge 4 (Caron) to year's end Clinton 3 (Robo). Max. Sept. 4 WRW 68 (Lynch & Carroll), Oct. 6 Paxton 104 (Jenkins), Oct. 29 Leesville Pond 42 (Lynch & Carroll), and Nov. 4 Broad Meadow Brook WS 45 (Gach).

- **BLUE-WINGED TEAL** (*Spatula discors*): Apr. 3 Bolton Flats 1 (Grant) to June 4 Bolton Flats 1 (Arena). Then, Aug. 27 Paxton 2 (Jenkins) to Oct. 4 Royalston 1 (LeBlanc). Max. Sept. 22 Hardwick 17 (Howes).
- NORTHERN SHOVELER (S. clypeata): All reports: Mar. 25 Brookfield 6 (Lusignan), up to 6 birds reported from Bolton Flats from Apr 2 (v.o.) to Apr. 9 (Pirro), and Oct. 22 Holden 2 (Robo). Max. Apr. 3 Bolton Flats 11 (Grant).
- GADWALL (Mareca strepera): A winter report from Coachlace Pond of up to 2 birds from Jan. 13 (B. Kamp, v.o.) to Feb. 19 (Kittredge). Then, in the spring, Apr. 8 Dexter Drumlin 2 (Lawson & Lawson, Robo) to Apr. 15 Bolton Flats 1 (Abbott, Lynch & Carroll). In the fall, Nov. 4 Northborough 1 (Abbott) to Dec. 16 Lake Quinsigamond 2 (deGraaf). Max. Apr. 8 Lancaster 8 (Abbott).
- **EURASIAN WIGEON** (*M penelope*): One report on Nov. 8 Southboro (Sudbury Res.) 1 female (Lynch & Carroll).
- AMERICAN WIGEON (M. americana): A winter report on Jan. 31 Northborough 2 (Spahr), and either an early migrant or over-winterer on Feb. 25 Charlton 1 (Kittredge). Then, the main spring period from Mar. 8 Quaboag Pond 6 (Bourget) to May 13 Westborough WMA 1 (Lawson & Lawson). In the fall, Sept. 20 Clinton 1 (Robo) to Dec. 17 Worcester 1 (Lynch & Carroll). Max. Apr. 3 Bolton Flats 16 (Grant).
- MALLARD (Anas platyrhynchos): Permanent resident. Max. Dec. 1 Gardner 400 (Pirro) and Dec. 16 Lake Quinsigamond 380 (DeGraaf).
- **AMERICAN BLACK DUCK** (A. rubripes): Permanent resident, but only scattered reports during breeding season. Max. Apr. 2 Bolton Flats 75 (Pirro) and Nov. 18 Holden 42 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **NORTHERN PINTAIL** (A. acuta): Winter report Jan 12 to Feb 23 Gardner 1 (Pirro), either an early migrant or winter report Feb. 12 Clinton 1 (Abbott). In spring, Mar. 5 Bolton Flats 6, also max. (Pirro) to May 3 Gardner 1 (Pirro). In the fall, Oct. 17 Holden 1 (Lynch & Carroll) to Dec. 26 Gardner 1 (Pirro).
- GREEN-WINGED TEAL (A. crecca): Feb. 26 Sterling 2 (Pirro) to May 3 Royalston 2 (LeBlanc). Outside the normal period, a report of a single bird from May 16 to August 23 Westborough (Miller) and a pair was reported from Bolton Flats May 4 (Sowizral) to June 11 (Lockwood). In the fall, Aug. 25 Otter River SF 4 (Lynch & Carroll) to Dec. 16 Clinton 1 (Kittredge). Spring Max. Apr. 9 Bolton Flats 152 (Hodson). Fall Max. Oct. 30 Hardwick 30 (Howes).
- **CANVASBACK** (Aythya valisineria): One report: Mar. 18 Westborough WMA 1 (v.o.) to Mar. 25 (Hodson, Dowling).
- RING-NECKED DUCK (A. collaris): Scattered winter reports. Then, Feb. 12 Worcester 1 (Lynch & Carroll) and Feb. 17 Clinton 5 (B. Kamp) to May 15 Princeton 3 (N. Williams). Returning Sept. 18 Westborough WMA 1 (Robo) to Dec. 17 Douglas 1 (Lynch & Carroll). Spring max. Mar. 12 Westborough WMA 222 (Lynch & Carroll) and Mar. 26 Douglas 238 (Lynch & Carroll). An astounding max. of 2789 was counted on the Sudbury Reservoir in Southborough on Nov. 8 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **TUFTED DUCK** (A. fuligula): Second Worcester County Record. May 14 (Pirro) to May 15 Keyes Brook Princeton (Pirro, v.o.). A male was discovered associating with 2 Ring-necked Ducks on May 14 (Pirro) and was enjoyed by various observers until the next day. The first report of the species was a male reported regularly and returning from 1995 to 2003 associating with Greater Scaup.

- GREATER SCAUP (A. marila): Scattered winter reports until Feb. 26 Wachusett Res. 1 (Pirro). In spring, Mar. 13 Millbury 1 (Berard) to Apr. 23 Westborough WMA 1 (Slovin). Returning Oct. 4 Quaboag IBA 3 (Lynch & Carroll) to Dec. 19 Wachusett Res. 19 (Lynch & Carroll). Spring max. Mar. 23 Wachusett Res. 18 (Lynch & Carroll). Fall max. Nov. 18 Wachusett Res. 160 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **LESSER SCAUP** (A. affinis): A winter report Jan. 1 Wachusett Res. 2 (Lynch & Carroll). In spring, Feb. 29 Westborough WMA up to 3 birds (Spahr, Kittredge) to Apr. 24 Quaboag Pond 3 (Bourget). Returning Sept. 30 Wachusett Res. 1 (Lynch & Carroll) to Dec. 12 Clinton 1 (Kittredge). Spring max. Mar. 1 Quaboag IBA 11 (Lynch & Carroll). Fall max. Nov. 18 Southborough 18 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **SURF SCOTER** (*Melanitta perspicillata*): Six reports, all in the fall: Sept. 30 Quaboag Pond 2 (Lynch & Carroll) to Nov. 25 Wachusett Res. 1 (Pirro). Reported only from Wachusett Res., Quaboag Pond, and SuAsCo.
- WHITE-WINGED SCOTER (M. fusca): Two spring reports, both from Quaboag Pond: May 15 a single bird, and May 22 three birds (Kittredge, Lynch & Carroll). In fall, 6 reports, all from Wachusett Res. from Oct. 24 1 (Lynch & Carroll) to Dec. 19, also a single bird. Max. Nov. 4 Wachusett Res. 4 (Pirro). Reported only from Wachusett Res., and Quaboag Pond.
- BLACK SCOTER (M. americana): Seven reports all in the fall from Oct. 25 Wachusett Res. 1 (Bourinot) to Nov. 5, also Wachusett Res. 1 (Young). Max. Oct. 27 Wachusett Res. 250 (Robo). Reported only from Wachusett Res., Crystal Lake, Mare Meadow Res., and Indian Lake.
- **LONG-TAILED DUCK** (Clangula hyemalis): All reports: Oct. 27 Wachusett Res. 3 (Robo), Nov. 2 Bolton Flats. 1 (Kittredge), Nov. 4 Wachusett Res. 46 (Lynch & Carroll), and Nov. 11 Sterling 1 (Robo, Dowling).
- BUFFLEHEAD (Bucephala albeola): Scattered winter reports until Feb. 4 Clinton 3 (Abbott). In spring Feb. 19 Clinton 1 (Kittredge) to May 11 Westborough WMA 2 (Kittredge). A single bird spent the summer and early fall at Wachusett Res. from May 14 (Robo) to Oct. 6 (Kittredge). Then, in the fall, Oct. 21 Wachusett Res. 2 (Dengler & Miller), to Dec. 17 Wachusett Res. 1 (Kittredge). Spring max. Mar. 25 Wachusett Res. 14 (Robo). Fall max. Nov. 8 Southborough 28 (Lynch & Carroll).
- COMMON GOLDENEYE (B. clangula): Scattered winter reports until Feb. 24 West Boylston 1 (Caron). In spring, Feb. 26 Fitchburg, Sterling, Wachusett Res. 1, 1, 14 (all by Pirro) to Apr. 18 Quaboag IBA 1 (Lynch & Carroll), and a late May 14 Fitchburg 1 (Caron). In fall, Nov. 4 Wachusett Res. 2 (Lynch & Carroll), to Dec. 30 Wachusett Res. 30 (Dowling). Spring max. Mar. 5 Wachusett Res. 57 (Lynch & Carroll). Fall max. Nov. 23 Southborough 105 (Dowling).
- BARROW'S GOLDENEYE (B. islandica): Two reports: Nov. 5 Southborough 1 (Abbott, Kittredge) to Nov. 21 (eBird), and Dec. 16 Boylston 1 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **HOODED MERGANSER** (Lophodytes cucullatus): Present year round. Max. Mar. 23 Westborough 200 (Schell), Mar. 20 Quaboag IBA 195 (Lynch & Carroll), Dec. 2 Quaboag IBA 240 (Lynch & Carroll).
- COMMON MERGANSER (Mergus merganser): Present year round, but most reports until May 13 Gardner 1 (Englehardt) and WRW 1 (Lynch & Carroll). A very late May 28 Rutland SF 1 (eBird). Breeding usually occurs in westernmost Worcester County, but no young reported this year. Summer reports with 3 birds in Quabbin Res. June 29 (Robo, Howes), 15 reported July 20 (Robo), and an unusual July 26 Sterling 2 (eBird). Returning in fall Sept. 30

- Quaboag IBA 1 (Lynch & Carroll) to year end. Max. Feb. 28 Westborough WMA 450 (Spahr), Mar. 4 Westborough WMA 600 (Spahr), Nov. 29 Quaboag IBA 658 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **RED-BREASTED MERGANSER** (M. serrator): All reports: up to 2 birds at Wachusett Res. Jan 15 (Pirro) to Feb. 5 (Bourinot), Mar. 29 Quaboag Pond 1 (Bourget), Apr. 9 Leominster 1 (Pirro), Nov. 4 Wachusett Res. 1 (Lynch & Carroll), Nov. 8 Westborough 1 (Lynch & Carroll), Nov. 11 Indian Lake 1 (Lynch & Carroll) and 6 Wachusett Res. (Pirro). Finally, Nov. 29 Quaboag IBA 1 (Lynch & Carroll).
- RUDDY DUCK (Oxyura jamaicensis): Only three spring reports: Mar. 3 Southborough 1 (Kittredge), Mar 13 Millbury 1 (Berard), and Mar. 20 Westborough WMA 3 (Garvey). Much stronger movement in fall, Oct. 4 Quaboag IBA 1 (Lynch & Carroll) to Dec. 16 Lake Quinsigamond 6 (deGraaf) and Wachusett Res. 1 (Kittredge). Max. Nov. 15 Orlando's Pond, Charlton 19 (Lynch & Carroll).
- **RUFFED GROUSE** (*Bonasa umbellus*): Permanent resident. Increasingly difficult to locate away from Quabbin and northwestern Worcester County. Max. July 3 Hardwick 12 (Howes), June 7 Rutland 8 (Caron), and Apr. 21 Gate 40 Quabbin Res. 6 (Mroz).
- WILD TURKEY (Meleagris gallopavo): Permanent resident. Max. Mar. 25 Rutland 86 (Bourinot), Mar. 27 Templeton 71 (Pirro), and Dec. 14 SCC 184.
- PIED-BILLED GREBE (*Podilymbus podiceps*): Mar. 12 Westborough WMA 1 (Spahr) and Mar 25 Westborough WMA 1 (Dowling) to Apr. 18 Quaboag IBA 1 (Lynch & Carroll) and May 2 Westborough WMA 1 (Robo, Kittredge). Summer reports: Aug. 6 to Sept. 2 Royalston 1 (LeBlanc), and Sept. 9 (Hardwick). Returning, Sept. 19 Sterling 2 (Robo) to Nov. 20 Westborough WMA (Spahr). Spring Max. Apr. 16 Oxford 3 (Berard). Fall Max. Nov. 1 Westborough WMA 4 (Gervais).
- **HORNED GREBE** (*Podiceps auritus*): Only one spring report: Apr. 18 Quaboag IBA 1 (Lynch & Carroll). In the fall, Oct. 1 Wachusett Res. 2 (Bourinot) to Dec. 4 Petersham 4, also max., (Lafley).
- **RED-NECKED GREBE** (*P. grisegena*): One spring report: Feb. 2 Wachusett Res. 1 (Kittredge, Robo). A late summer report of a bird at Wachusett Res. Aug. 27 (Bourinot) to Sept. 10 (Dekker). In the fall: Sept. 20 Gardner 1 (Pirro), Oct. 25 Spencer 1 (Lynch & Carroll) to Nov. 11 Wachusett Res. 1 (Pirro, Robo).
- ROCK PIGEON (*Columba livia*): Permanent resident. Max. Jan. 9 Athol 130 (Watkevich), Nov. 22 Templeton 150 (Pirro), Dec. 14 SCC 534, and Dec. 16 ACC 518.
- **MOURNING DOVE** (*Zenaida macroura*): Permanent resident. Max. Nov. 14 Westborough WMA 140 (Miller), and Dec. 14 SCC 538.
- **YELLOW-BILLED CUCKOO** (*Coccyzus americanus*): Increased reports likely due to the gypsy moth invasion. May 13 Oxford 1 (Berard) to Aug. 20 Wachusett Meadows WS 1 (Dea). Max. June 10 Westborough WMA 8 (Brookline Bird Club).
- BLACK-BILLED CUCKOO (*C. erythropthalamus*): Increased reports likely due to the gypsy moth invasion. May 10 Broad Meadow Brook WS 1 (Liller) to Sept. 2 Wachusett Meadows WS 1 (Gallagher) and High Ridge WMA 1 (Pirro). Max. June 10 Brookfields 9 (Lynch & Carroll) and May 28 Westborough 9 (Miller).
